

Language and Literacy


- Read with your child often. Ask question as you do. What are the characters feeling? What do you think will happen next?
- Point out letters and words in the environment, especially capital and lowercase. Read signs aloud.
- Practice rhyming with your child—rhyming nonsense words counts!








Mathematics

- Look for and point out shapes in the environment. A sandwich is a square, a slice of pizza is a triangle, a stop sign is an octagon.
- Have your child help with chores and count as you do them. Count plates as you set the table, count shirts as you fold laundry.
- Talk with your child about the meaning of words used in math, such as add, take away, equal, more, and less.


Physical Well-Being & Motor Development


- Talk with your child about safety, such as crossing the street and who to go to for help with strangers.




Social Foundations




